

How can you use *recensio.net*?

... as editorial staff

How can your review sections be published on *recensio.net*? Discuss with us how your publication mode, your target group and your regular readers can each be integrated into the concept of *recensio.net*, while ensuring the independence of your editorial activities. We will work with you on a continuous basis, and guarantee long-term archival storage by the Bavarian State Library.

... as an author

Present your own monographs and articles by giving a brief and clear outline of your thesis statements, your methodology and/or your discussion of existing research approaches, thus putting up your historical publication for discussion ("live reviews").

... as a user

Search the review sections of several well-established journals in full text. Comment on reviews and presentations, and become involved in the discussion of current topics and approaches within the field of European History.

recensio.net is a Europe-wide, multilingual platform for reviews of historical literature.

recensio.net brings together “classic” reviews

Editorial offices of journals who have only published in print so far are able to publish their review sections prominently online (pre- or post-print).

The co-operating editorial staffs continue working independently. The review sections of the different journals remain separate and enable targeted access.

recensio.net en route to web 2.0

Authors are able to present the core statements of their publications (monographs or articles) on *recensio.net*.

Gradually, monitored user comments will create “live reviews” based on these presentations.

Academic online resources can also be presented and reviewed here, to allow for the continuous development of the resources.

recensio.net is committed to the principles of Open Access and accessible free of charge.

We focus on work published in Europe and featuring European topics – including national and regional ones.

The platform’s navigational languages are English, German and French, while the reviews may be written in any European language.

recensio.net offers

- a highly increased prominence for reviews by providing a comprehensive platform search facility and connection to the OPAC;
- a faster publication process, bringing the review closer to the publication date of the reviewed text; thus
- a modern adaptation to changing reading behaviours differing greatly between reviews and articles.

The Bavarian State Library guarantees to support the reviews with metadata, connection to library catalogues (OPAC), and long-term archival storage.
